North Waziristan Displacement Response

18 February 2015

IOM continues to identify Afghan families displaced by ongoing conflict in Pakistan's North Waziristan Agency (NWA). The families had been living in Pakistan for an average of 27 years, mainly in the city of Miran Shah.

As of 18 February, 1,568 families (8,570 individuals) have been assessed in Khost, Paktika, Kabul and Nangarhar provinces. Humanitarian assistance, including Non-Food Items (NFIs), hygiene kits, food, emergency shelters and winter kits, has been delivered to 779 families. Distributions were held in Khost on 5 and 14 February benefitting 350 families. Additional distributions are planned for displaced families in Nangarhar in the coming weeks.

Current support for IOM's response activities is being provided by the governments of Japan and Germany, and the United Nations Common Humanitarian Fund (CHF).
