



IOM Afghanistan

North Waziristan Displacement Response

23 July 2015

IOM continues to identify Afghan families displaced by conflict in Pakistan's North Waziristan Agency (NWA). As of 23 July, 2,163 families (11,860 individuals) have been assessed in Khost, Paktika, Kabul and Nangarhar provinces.

While assistance has reached a total of 1,199 families, displaced families have told IOM staff during Focus Group Discussions and Post-Distribution Monitoring visits that further assistance, particularly food and shelter, is needed. Vulnerable groups among those interviewed included numerous female-headed households as well as families with disabled, chronically ill and elderly members. Most of those interviewed stated that they did not plan to return to Pakistan in the foreseeable future.

Support for IOM's response activities is provided by the Government of Japan and the Common Humanitarian Fund (CHF).
