



IOM Afghanistan

North Waziristan Displacement Response

7 September 2015

IOM continues to identify Afghan families displaced by conflict in Pakistan's North Waziristan Agency (NWA). As of 7 September, 2,233 families (12,250 individuals) have been assessed in Khost, Paktika, Kabul and Nangarhar provinces.

Nearly all of the families interviewed by IOM had been living in Miran Shah, Pakistan for an average of 27 years prior to their displacement. Over half (52%) of the individuals assessed are children. In Khost, 9% of households are female-headed. All of the families assessed in Nangarhar, Paktika and Kabul are from those provinces originally. Families assessed in Khost are originally from Khost (50%), Paktika (25%), Paktya (9%) and Baghlan (6%).
