## 2021 Highlights

**514,423** total returns from Iran and Pakistan since 01 January 2021

**508,847** total returns from Iran in 2021

**5,576** total returns from Pakistan in 2021

Over the past week **35,366** undocumented Afghans returned from Iran with **3%** of returnees from Iran (**950** individuals) assisted (**690** men and **260** women)

Over the past week **353** undocumented Afghans returned from Pakistan with **95%** of returnees from Pakistan (**336** individuals) assisted (**174** men and **162** women)

## Return from Iran

According to the Border Monitoring Team of the Directorate of Refugees and Repatriation (DoRR), a total of **35,366** Afghans returned from Iran through the Nimroz (Milak) and Herat (Islam Qala) borders between 28 May-3 June 2021. **17,124** persons returned voluntarily and **18,242** were deported. Since 01 January 2021, the total number of undocumented returnees from Iran is **508,847** individuals- a **42% increase over the same period in 2020**. IOM provided post-arrival humanitarian assistance to **950 (3%)** undocumented Afghans at the IOM Transit Centers in Herat and Nimroz during the past week. **Assistance levels continue to be limited by a lack of funding and bear no relation to the vulnerability of the returning population.**

On 29 April, the Government of Iran announced a border closure with Afghanistan to prevent the transmission of COVID-19. Afghan nationals including migrants will still be allowed to return home during this period.

## Cross Border Response Funding Needs 2021

Against a [funding request](#) of **USD 29.7M** in 2021 to serve an estimated return caseload of **654,000 Afghan migrants**— a figure which is likely to be exceeded during the summer— **IOM has only received 5% of its requirement**. **Despite urgent and growing humanitarian needs, without additional funding support humanitarian operations at border level transit centers face suspension on 31 July with week on week assistance levels already extremely constrained despite humanitarian needs.**

## COVID-19 Programming Update

IOM is actively supporting the Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) and WHO in provision of [COVID-19 response interventions](#). On 25 March, IOM launched its new 2021 global COVID-19 appeal— the Strategic Response and Recovery Plan. IOM Afghanistan is seeking 17m USD in 2021 to continue response efforts. Activities include training for frontline health workers, deployment of staff to areas of need including health facilities and cross border surveillance, material support of PPE/equipment, ambulance based referral services and community level awareness raising efforts including within Displacement Tracking Matrix focus group discussions in over 12,600 settlements across 34 provinces.

## IOM Thematic Support

### Migration Health:

In 2021, 176,673 patients have been served by IOM's Migration Health Unit in Nimroz, Herat, Kandahar and Nangarhar provinces with basic health care- outpatient consultations, maternal, child and neo-natal health care, reproductive health, family planning and COVID-19 response. Programming is supported by CERF. During the past week a total of 3,747 patients were served by IOM's 7 mobile health teams, inclusive of 2,325 outpatient consultations, health education sessions for 3,747 persons and psychosocial counselling sessions for 232 patients.

Under the Global Fund multi-country TB grant in partnership with UNDP, a total of 10,518 undocumented Afghans were screened for tuberculosis at the Zero Point Reception Centers in Herat, Nimroz, Kandahar and Nangarhar. Of the total screened, 240 presumptive TB cases were identified.

### Protection:

IOM's Protection programme has supported 1,683 undocumented returnee households (2,185 women, 2,078 men, 3,377 girls and 3,876 boys) comprising at least one Person with Specific Needs (PSN) in 2021 through provision of timely information, facilitating safe and dignified access to services, and provision of one-off assistance including cash to mitigate identified protection risks and avoid resort to negative coping mechanisms when referral pathways are exhausted.

With screening staff operating at the Herat and Nimroz border points and case workers in 11 provinces of return, the Protection team caseload this week included case management assessments for 87 new PSN households (112 women, 116 men, 221 girls, 233 boys) in Ghor, Nangarhar, Takhar, Herat, Kandahar, Sar-e-Pul, Badakhshan, Faryab, Nimroz, Kabul, and Balkh. These cases included 32 children at risk, 21 persons with serious medical conditions, 15 women at risk, 16 older persons at risk and 6 separated or unaccompanied children, 426 PSN individuals (and their households) were identified at Milak and Islam Qala border points by Protection screeners in coordination with DoRR. 22 undocumented returnee households (25 women, 32 men, 24 girls, 31 boys) received Post-arrival support services (e.g. provision of mobile phones, family tracing, and transportation) and case management assessments were conducted for all 87 cases.

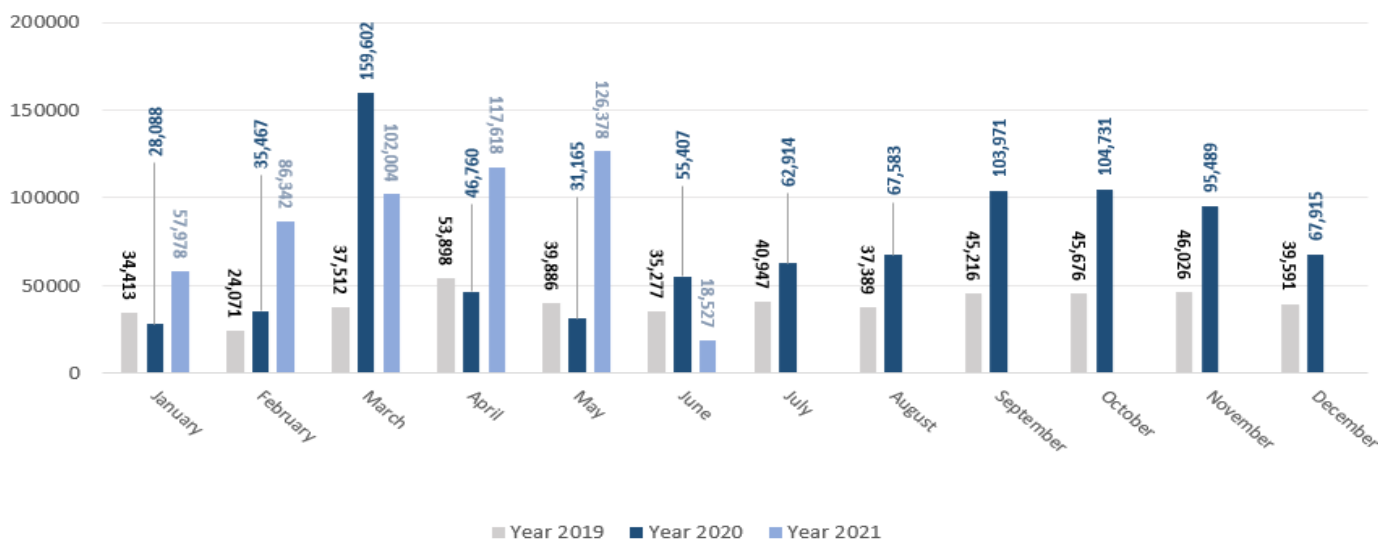

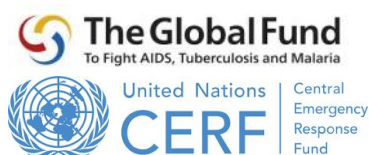
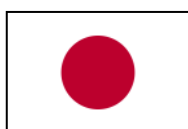
