
North Waziristan Displacement Response

12 January 2015

IOM continues to identify Afghan families displaced by ongoing conflict in Pakistan's North Waziristan Agency (NWA). The families had been living in Pakistan for an average of 27 years, mainly in the city of Miran Shah.

As of 12 January, 1,423 families (7,683 individuals) have been assessed in Khost, Paktika, Kabul and Nangarhar provinces. Humanitarian assistance, including Non-Food Items (NFIs), hygiene kits, food and emergency shelters, has been delivered to 773 families. Current support for IOM's response activities is being provided by the governments of Japan and Germany, and the United Nations Common Humanitarian Fund (CHF).

Following the latest assessments, IOM plans to distribute 500 winterization kits and 400 winterized tents in Khost over the next two months.

In Nangarhar, Paktika and Kabul, 100% of families assessed have returned to their province of origin. Forty-eight percent of the families assessed in Khost originate from Khost, followed by Paktika (19%), Paktia (10%) and Baghlan (10%). Nearly all of the families assessed in the four provinces meet IOM's vulnerability criteria for "poor families".
