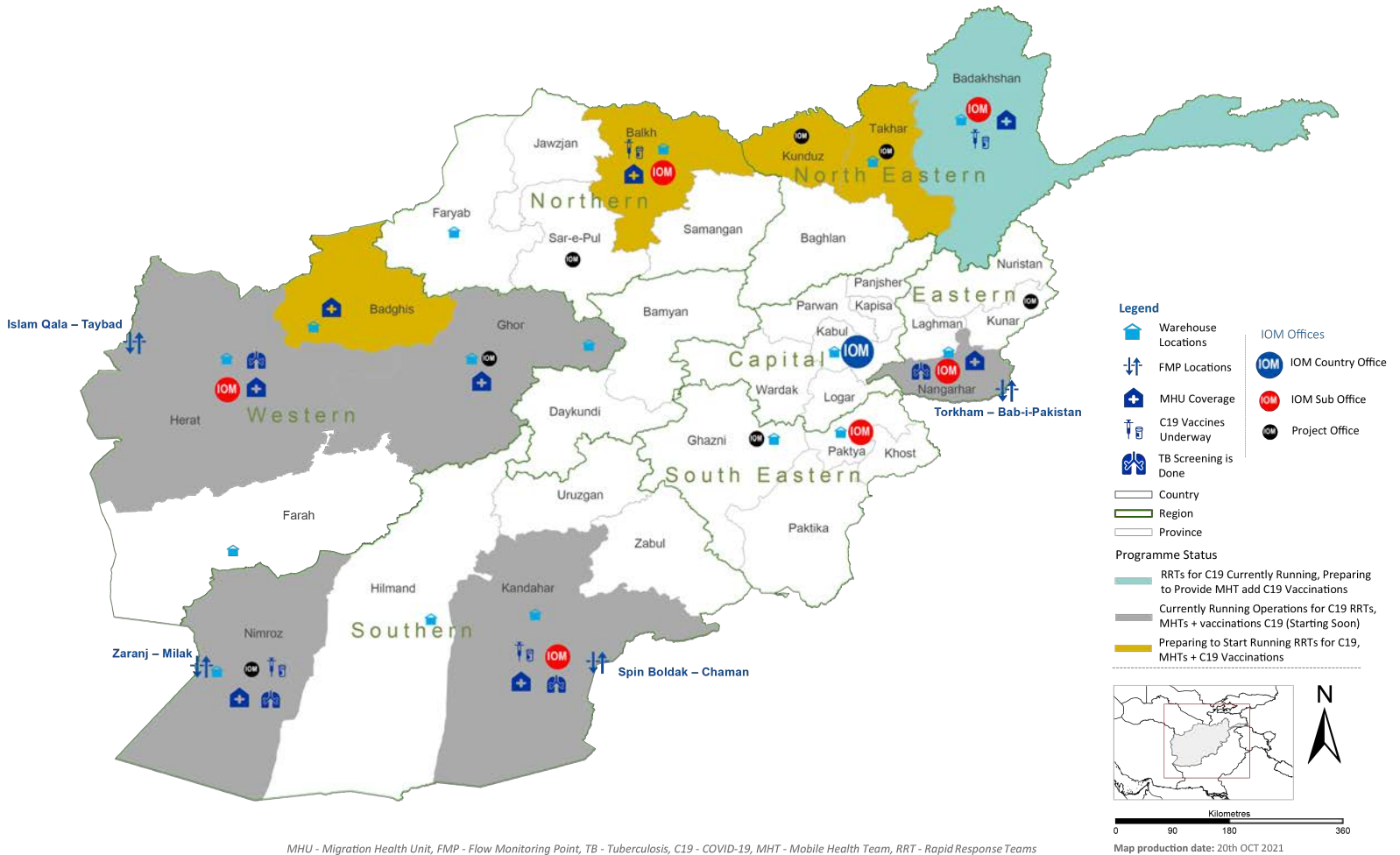


MIGRATION HEALTH OPERATIONAL PRESENCE



IOM's Migration Health Programming is fully **operational in 8 border provinces**, bordering Pakistan, Iran, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, with expansion to 11 set in the coming weeks. With over 200 dedicated staff working on health programming, since the beginning of the year, **more than half a million people have received essential health assistance**. IOM's health teams closely coordinate with multiple partners and stakeholders in Afghanistan at all levels, and IOM is rapidly increasing capacity and adapting to support and fill urgent gaps to support the health system both in the short, and longer term.

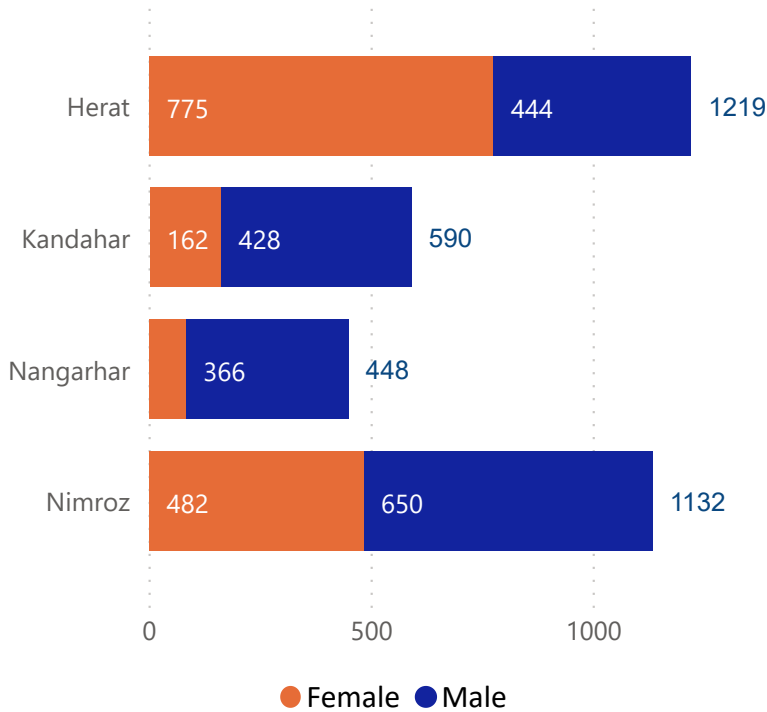

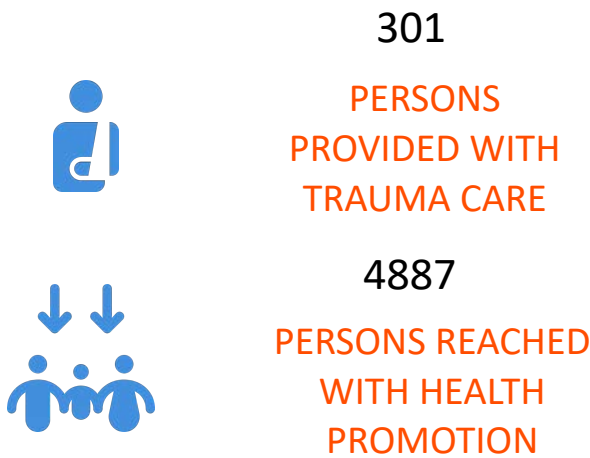
OPD CONSULTATIONS BY PROVINCE



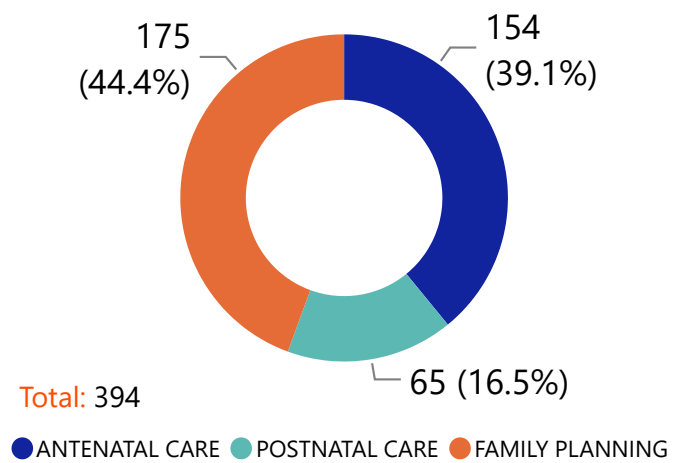

REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH FOR WOMEN AND GIRLS

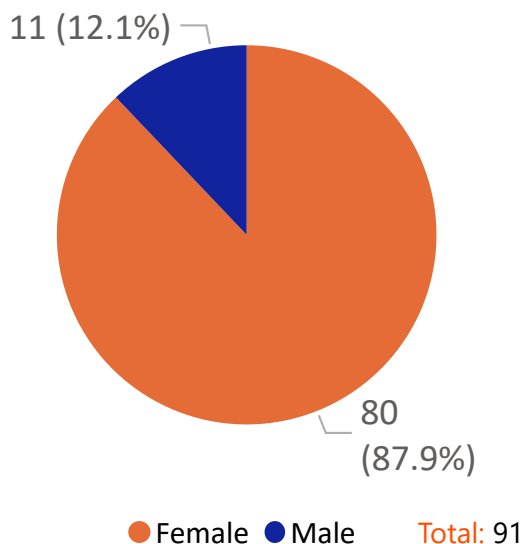

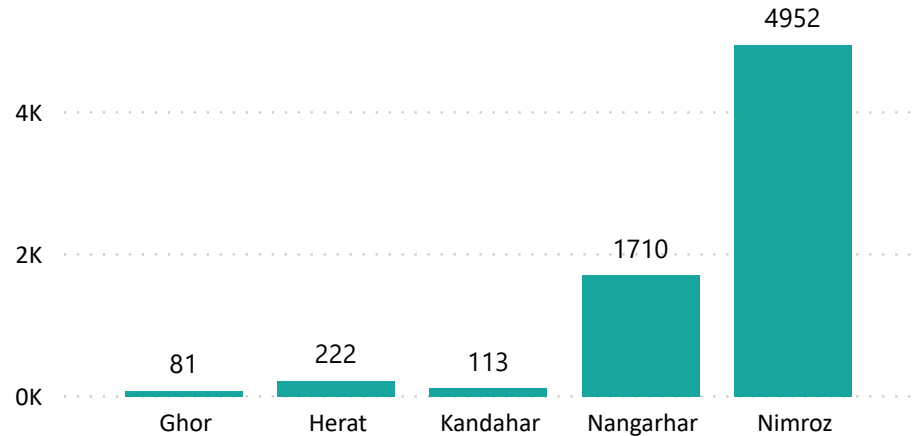

COVID-19 VACCINE DOSES ADMINISTERED



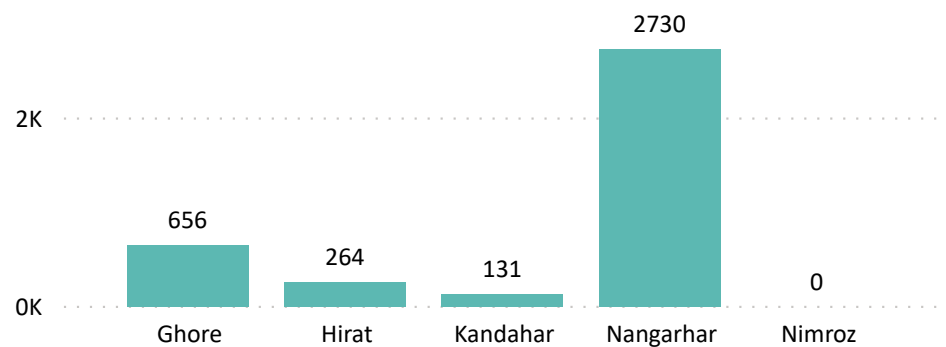
IOM's services regarding COVID-19 include screening for COVID-19, targeted health promotion and community engagement, demand generation activities for COVID-19 vaccinations, testing (RDT/PCR) and referral for COVID positive cases.

IOM complemented COVID-19 vaccination is being implemented in 5 provinces, **Balkh, Badakhshan, Kandahar and Nimroz and Badghis**, through seconding Vaccinators to the Provincial Public Health Directorate (PPHD).

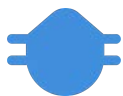

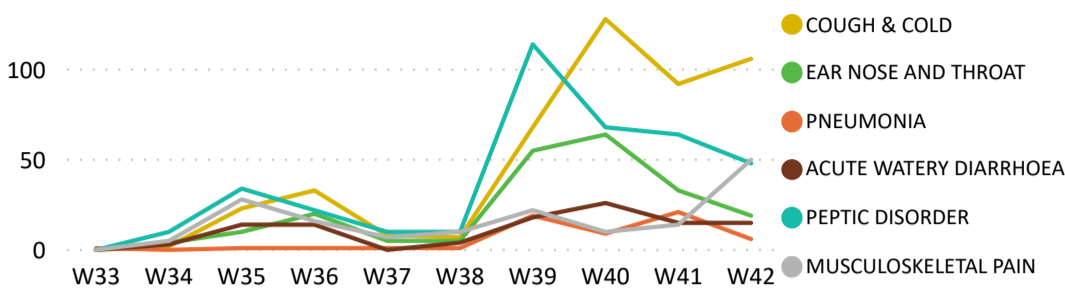

PERSONS VACCINATED AGAINST COVID-19 WITH IOM SUPPORT

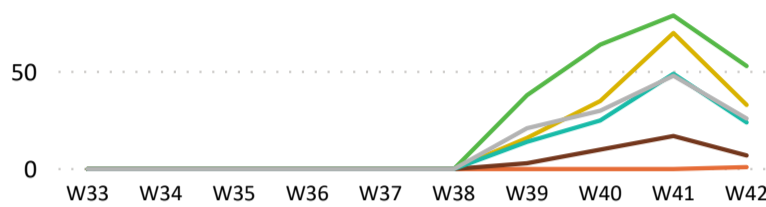
DISEASE SURVEILLANCE TRENDS (COMMON AILMENTS)

HERAT

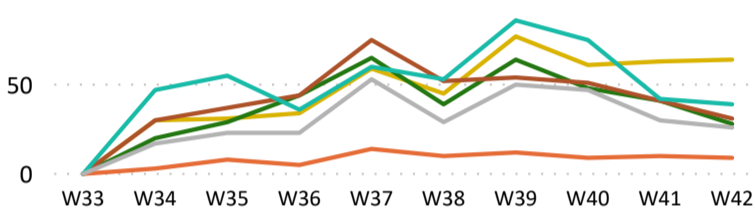

TUBERCULOSIS

IOM has been conducting Tuberculosis (TB) programming in 4 border provinces - Herat, Kandahar, Nangarhar, and Nimroz. TB screening is being implemented through an active case finding approach for the cross-border mobile population through this programme. IOM also strengthens diagnostic capacity, facilitation of laboratory testing, sample collection, transportation for testing, provides support for coordination, contact tracing, registration and follow-up of positive cases at their destination.
